

UC San Diego's 53 incredible <u>Community Service Officials</u> work tirelessly to ensure our campus remains a safe and welcoming environment for everyone. Your safety is their primary mission. These dedicated students serve as the backbone of campus safety, providing crucial support and serving as the eyes and ears for the UC San Diego Police Department. CSOs perform several functions on campus, including:

- **Providing safety escorts:** If you need to travel from point A to point B on campus, especially late at night or in low-visibility areas, our CSOs are ready to provide safe escorts from sunset to sunrise by calling (858) 534-9255.
- **Patrolling grounds:** Whether on foot, bike or vehicle, CSOs maintain a visible presence to deter potential safety risks and promptly address concerns. CSOs assist with medical aid and radio police dispatch at signs of danger, unsafe situations or crimes in progress so officers can respond.
- **Monitoring buildings:** From securing doors to reporting maintenance needs, CSOs help keep university facilities functional and protected, which includes providing contracted support for many campus businesses.
- **Assisting in emergencies:** Trained to respond quickly, CSOs provide critical support during incidents and collaborate with UCPD when needed.

Let's celebrate our CSOs' unwavering commitment to our community. If you see a CSO, don't hesitate to thank them for all they do!

Fun Fact: In 2023, CSOs completed 253 safe escorts for students and employees.

Caity Simmers | Making Waves

Meet Caitlin "Caity" Simmers, daughter of Jesse Simmers, a Maintenance Electrician in Facilities
Management. Born in 2005, Caity grew up surfing and competed in her first contest at 10. With her parents'

support, she traveled to competitions throughout California and beyond. By 12, she finished 9th at the ISA World Surfing Games in Japan, and by 13, she won the U16 ISA World Title and other prestigious events.

At 15, Caity won the U.S. Open of Surfing and by 16, she joined the World Tour. In her first year on the Pro Tour (2023), she won two events and was nominated "Rookie of the Year." In 2024, she won three events, including Pipeline and Bells Beach and secured the World Title at Lower Trestles, becoming the youngest woman to achieve this feat.

Jesse, who has worked at UC San Diego since 2015, is grateful for the support that allowed him to travel with Caity to events worldwide. He says, "It's been an amazing experience, and I'm thankful for this job." The Simmers family's journey is a testament to dedication, hard work and the power of family support.
